
LOCAL ARTIST HAS EXHIBITION AT KEAN

Barbara Prestridge, a Scotch Plains resident and art teacher at Park Middle School, is exhibiting 15 of her paintings in an exhibition at Kean University. "Emergence; MA Studio Thesis Exhibition, featuring Barbara Prestridge and George Rateau," This culminating exhibition for the graduating Master's degree candidates is open to the public April 20 through May 14, 2017. The opening reception will be held Sunday, April 23, 1:00-3:00 with comments by the exhibiting artists at 2 pm. The exhibition and reception/talk is in the James Howe Gallery in the Vaughn-Eames building on the Union campus.

Prestridge's art addresses the unique and magical qualities of the watercolor medium combined with charcoal. As a longtime realistic portrait artist, these new paintings reflect her journey to abstract expressionism through botanical landscapes that are filled with trails, elusive labyrinths and architectural suggestions. These are studies of contrasts; loose flow and control, clear and obscure, ethereal and earthy. HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE DAY

Sholom of Scotch Plains will commemorate Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Remembrance Day) with a special Service of Remembrance and Hope. Dr. Susan Lederman, a hidden child during the Holocaust, will share her story of survival followed by a Yom HaShoah liturgy, compiled by Cantor Darcie Sharlein. The program is free and open to the public.

Dr. Lederman was born in Bratislava, Czechoslovakia in 1937. She, her parents and one great aunt were able to survive by hiding. Susan lived with a Christian family in a small village and later with a Hungarian family in Bratislava; her parents hid in a bombed-out factory. They were liberated in 1945 by the Russians and emigrated to the United States in 1948, settling in Queens, New York. Dr. Lederman went on to become a prominent Political Scientist, serving on the faculty of Kean University since 1977 where she is now Professor Emerita of Public Administration. In 1980, she co-authored with Gerald M. Pomper, the book Elections in America: Control and Influence in Democratic Politics. Dr. Lederman has served as president, director or chair of many civic and professional organizations including the League of Women Voters of the United States, the Common Cause National Governing Association and the Northeastern Political Science Association. She also served as President of Temple Sinai in Summit from 1993 to 1994; she and her husband live in New Providence and are the parents of two grown children.

Following Dr. Lederman's presentation, Cantor Darcie Sharlein will lead a special

On Sunday, April 23, 2017 at 7 p.m., Temple of children from the Shoah, including music member of the Union for Reform Judaism. written by 11 year old Alec Volkoviski for a music competition in the Vilna Ghetto in 1943; excerpts from Anne Frank's diary; and stories and poems written by children imprisoned in Terezin concentration camp. Six candles will be lit by Temple Sholom members whose lives, as Holocaust refugees or children and grandchildren of survivors, have been affected by the Holocaust. The entire program is underwritten by the Nathanson Adult Education Fund.

> As witnesses to the Holocaust age, fewer are left to tell their stories. "Our children are the last generation to get to hear live testimony," says Marjorie B. Leffler, a parent and member of Temple Sholom's Yom HaShoah committee. Dr. Ann L. Saltzman, chair of the committee and Director Emerita of the Drew University Center for Holocaust/Genocide Study, adds that "Remembrance/memory is an integral part of Jewish tradition. We remember the fall of the temple on Tisha B'Av and we commemorate the millions who lost their lives in the Holocaust on Yom HaShoah. "Rabbi Joel Abraham adds that "Temple Sholom has always had a strong commitment to remembering the Shoah. TWO SCOTCH PLAINS RESIDENTS NAMED CASAS

Hely administered oaths to 16 community members on March 20, 2017 — among them Carmen Ayala and Linda Jenkins-Davis of Scotch Plains — who stepped up to volunteer as extra eyes and ears for Family Court judges on cases involving Union County's abused, neglected or abandoned children now placed in foster care.

The new child advocates completed 30 hours in a new, flexible training option that comprises fewer in-person sessions than the traditional session, but incorporates an online learning component for scheduling flexibility. After the new advocates took their oath and received a commemorative CASA pin and certificate, they gathered with staff and board members for a mission is to provide an advocate for every foster celebratory luncheon, during which they were matched to their new case.

Volunteers with varied backgrounds make successful advocates and this class is no exception: Advocates range in age from 21 to 81; are parents and non-parents; recent retirees and students; and careers include business professionals, a teacher, nurse, attorney and professor; as well as homemakers. Languages

Union County Superior Court Judge James spoken include Spanish, Chinese, Ukrainian and German. Most have no prior knowledge of the foster system, and at least two of the volunteers are immigrants.

> CASA volunteers have court-ordered access to all parties in a child's life, including foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, and incorporate into court reports findings from these contacts as well as time spent with the youth. Volunteers advocate both in the community and court to ensure their youth's needs are met and their time in care is as short as possible. There are 600 Union County children currently in foster care and CASA of Union County serves approximately one-third; its child that needs one.
