

SPRING IS HATCHING AT WARREN TOWNSHIP SCHOOLS

Mother Nature has a sense of humor. As Warren Township (and much of the northeast) was digging out from Winter Storm Stella, that sure sign of spring was hatching in our elementary schools... soft, fuzzy chicks.

Kindergarteners and first graders spent a week carefully tending to a dozen fertilized eggs in their classrooms, learning about a chick's lifecycle while rotating the eggs and monitoring temperature and humidity in the incubator. The fuzzy barnyard babies began pecking their way out of their shells on March 13, just as Stella was bearing down on the area.

The elementary schools partner each year with the Pennsylvania-based Quiver Farm Project which provides the fertilized eggs as part of an educational outreach program. The youngsters care for the chicks, making sure they are fed, watered and warm before sending them home to Quiver Farm.

IN A DIVORCE, WHO GETS CUSTODY OF THE PETS?

One of the issues which arises with ever-increasing frequency in divorce cases is who gets "custody" of the pets. A 2015-2016 survey conducted by the American Pet Products Association estimates that 65% of all U.S. households have at least one pet. Combining this with the constant reporting that 50% of all marriages end in divorce ensures that there will be ongoing contentious discussions as to who will be awarded the parties' pets.

Several weeks ago, Alaska modified its divorce statutes to make it the first state in the country to obligate judges to take "into consideration the well-being of the animal" and to explicitly empower judges to order joint custody of pets.

The "Dogington Post" (yes that's right) has reported proposed language one animal rights group suggests be used by Courts in awarding "custody" or possession of dogs in divorce matters. "In determining who should be awarded custody, the court may want to consider which party has paid attention to the animal's basic daily needs (food, shelter, physical care, exercise, grooming, flea control); who takes the animal to the veterinarian; who provides for social interactions (in the case of dogs) with other dogs and/or with people; who maintains appropriate supervision to assure that state and local regulations are complied with (licensing, not allowing the dog to run free and protecting against circumstances that would endanger her life or health); and who has the greatest ability to financially support the animal."

Generally without exception pets are legally considered

personal property and, in New Jersey, are awarded to one of the parties in the event of a divorce. However, as with other types of property, pets can be considered pre-marital property and be awarded to the spouse who owned the pet prior to the marriage. I have seen an increase in the number of individuals who insist on pets being covered in their prenuptial agreement to ensure that the pet remains their possession regardless of a future divorce. Spouses are now also including provisions in post-nuptial agreements as to the future "custody" of their beloved pets.

Over the years parties have adopted a more reasonable approach to pets, post-divorce. The former spouses have used a "time-sharing" agreement with respect to their marital pets and have used mediation to get the mutually desired schedule. If one of the parties violates such an agreement, Courts have enforced the agreements and sanctioned the spouse who violates the agreement.

As with many other 21st century issues in divorce the determination of who will be awarded possession or "custody" of the parties' pets in a divorce is evolving. 





ALIGNMENT ASSIGNMENT

Pronation is the motion that helps feet absorb and disperse shock when walking or running. The elongating and flattening of the arches allow the feet to roll inward and overcome the shock. Over time, either excessive or insufficient pronation can negatively affect shock absorption, potentially resulting in problems with joints, bones, and tendons of the feet and the lower legs. A podiatrist can determine if there is a pronation problem. Subject to its cause and severity, the podiatrist will recommend appropriate measures to alleviate the issue. In many cases, a custom orthotic will be prescribed in order to correct poor pronation. If there is a more serious underlying condition, surgery may be necessary.

Causes of pronation can vary. It may develop early on in a person's development. Often, pronation occurs as a result of strain on the foot. Excessive weight on the arch of the foot may weaken the tissue, resulting in pronation. Elderly people may also suffer from weakened muscles and tissues in the foot causing the arch to collapse. 



With humble beginnings as a wedding band, the Miami Sound Machine had already been well known in the Miami area in the late 70's and early 80's. In 1977 with the addition of a young vocalist named Gloria Maria Fajardo Garcia, later known as Gloria Estefan, they became a phenomenon of the Latin music

But it wasn't until Discos CBS, a subsidiary of CBS International, put out the album Primitive Love on Epic Records in 1985 that the band crossed over into mainstream megasuccess. And Jim Hayes, president of Discos CBS, was at the helm.

"Gloria was in my office three or four times a week," he remembers from his apartment at The Chelsea at Warren assisted living residence in Warren, NJ. "She didn't think we were spending enough money on promoting the group, and she was right."

The rest is history, of course, and Jim has the platinum album to prove it.

"I really wanted that job," he says, recalling the six years he spent in Miami. He had been a veteran of the publishing industry, working for several book companies, one of which was acquired by CBS.

He jumped at the chance to become President and General Manager of Discos CBS, wanting a job with more excitement and a change of scenery. That was in 1985, just as the Miami Sound Machine emerged into the main stream. Hayes was in the driver's seat."Gloria and my daughter Carrie became friends," he says.

Today, Hayes, 83, is surrounded by dozens of photo albums, photos of his 6 children, 19 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren, and technology that keeps him connected via internet, phone and TV.

"This is my life," he says.

INICA KOTASTHANE WINS TIME FOR KIDS 2017 POETRY CONTEST

"My locker is a monster, it's absolutely true! It eats my books, my bag, my pens; once it ate my shoes!"

With that entertaining opening verse of "My Locker is a Monster," 13-year-old Inica Kotasthane became the Grand Prize winner of this year's TIME for Kids Poetry Contest.

Kotasthane's rhythmic poem was among 1,500 submissions, winning the top prize with funny, insightful and somewhat autobiographical prose.

"I entered because I thought it'd be a fun way to share my poetry skills and my experiences in middle school," says Kotasthane. "I got most of my inspiration for the poem from what happens pretty much every day... my locker is jammed and all of my stuff is stuck inside it. I think it's a cute poem that a lot of middle school kids can relate to."

"Its wide-open jaws snatch everything in sight. Goodbye, science homework! There's no doing you tonight. You want to borrow a pencil? I'm sorry, I've got none left. I don't have any paper, either. My locker's committed a theft."

"My Locker is a Monster" appears on the TIME for Kids website and in the March 13 print edition. As Grand Prize winner, the 7th grader also received an autographed copy of "One Minute till Bedtime," a collection of poetry edited by former children's poet laureate Kenn Nesbitt as well as an online classroom visit from Nesbitt.

"Congratulations, Inica. You won!," Nesbitt said via a Skype session with Kotasthane's class on March 20. "That's no small feat because we received 1,500 submissions and yours was the best."

Nesbitt, who lives in Spokane, Washington, recalled how his father recited poetry to him as a child and how he came to love rhyming text. The poet read a few of his own poems and took questions from Kotasthane and her classmates.

"I know I didn't do my homework, but it isn't even my fault! My locker has it, of course, hidden deep in its vault."

"Inica is an incredibly bright girl and a very strong writer," says language arts teacher Gina Banks. "Her creativity, work ethic and shining personality make her an absolute pleasure to have in class. She is also very mature and very proactive about asking for feedback on her writing pieces. I'm so proud of her but not surprised (that she won this award). She loves to enter contests and she gives 150% to everything she does."
